All programs will be given in the auditoriums of the respective schools. Those in the afternoon will begin at 2:30 P. M. and those in the evening at 7:15 P. M.

**ATHLETIC CLUB IS FORMED HERE**

17 Charter Members Enrolled in Group Organized to Promote Amateur Sports

Organization of a Birmingham Athletic Club, whose stated purpose is "to promote and perpetuate athletics," was completed Tuesday afternoon at a meeting of Birmingham youths, most of them former Baldwin High School athletes, controlled as charter members.

According to Hartwell Ladd, acting chairman of the club, the organization plans to place athletic teams in amateur competition in all major sports, including basketball, football, baseball and possibly swimming. The club has already entered a team in the Birmingham Y. M. C. A. basketball league.

The organization will apply for registration in the A. A. U. Ladd said, and will hold meetings every Tuesday evening in the club's office at 1111 West Market street. The last meeting of each month will be devoted to a business session.

To be eligible for membership, each applicant must be qualified to make up in at least one sport. He must be a resident of Birmingham, and must be approved by a majority vote of the membership after attending two regular meetings of the club.
