They Will Not Seek Posts
On New City Commission

PACKARD, SMITH TO RUN
Of the seven members of the present City Commission only two have resigned definitely for re-election in April, three are undecided, and two will not run, it was learned by The Evening Star.

Both City President Harry Allen, who is completing four years in office, and Commissioner W. Osborne, who was elected last spring, declared positively they would not stand for re-election when the first Commission is chosen under the proposed new charter April 3.

PACKARD, SMITH TO RUN
Commissioners Francis S. Packard and T. B. Smith will be candidates for re-election, they said, while the other three, Commissioner Maurice J. Conkoff, City Controller J. Lawrence Hulbert, were non-committal.

Mr. Hulbert said that matters arising in his business this week would influence him one way or the other, but that he would make his final decision next week. He positively said he "would prefer to stay out of it," but might enter later in April.

Mr. Lowman, although he has been considered as a highly probable candidate for Commission posts, weeks, and is expected to be considering the matter favorably.

Meaning the outside of Mr. Packard and Mr. Smith, no other candidates have announced themselves for Commission posts. Three petitions were taken out from the city office by an unknown person during the past week, and the names of the candidates, although neither the candidates for whom the petitions are being taken, nor the names to which they aspire have been disclosed.

Other candidates for the office are: Charles H. Adams, present city attorney; J. A. Hart, 372 Harrison avenue, who has been active in the bar but is now engaged in the real estate business; and Floyd S. Buck, also a former member of the bar.

One of the two candidates for associate justice is a woman, Mrs. J. A. Hart, who is an attorney, although not engaged in active practice. The other is named as "Oscar Metcalf," whose name is being put forward by the Birmingham Township Board.

Three candidates in the field for the position of clerk are: Rufus Street; Charles E. Hamlin, 253 Vinewood; and James Parks, 705 Bates street.
