"In answer to his own question, 'What of the future Communist Communism succeed?' Mr. Hyde replied that Communism must succeed. If anything else is established, he explained, "there will be only chaos left. However, we are only Communists remaining in Russia today. They will be change sometime, but I am not sure that it will be gradual."

Individual deposit loans to the cash on hand, deposits in banks and United States Government bonds in each such institution. Such payments shall only be allowed for necessary purposes, such as paying bank transit notes created on and after Feb. 23, 1933, necessary living expenses, tax payments, or other obligations to the State of Michigan and subdivisions thereof, or to the Federal Government, and with bill of lading attached, R. F. C. notes on bills of lading for fare purposes, and such other purposes necessary for the ordinary conduct of business, providing always that no deposit shall be preferred, as against any other depositor.

Such modifications in the foregoing limitations may be necessary in extraordinary cases and may be allowed with the consent of the State banking commissioner, provided that no deposit shall be preferred, as against any other depositor.
