Warning that not enough money has yet been collected in current school taxes to keep the schools open, and that "the danger of their closing is not yet past," letters addressed to between 2,500 and 3,000 Bloomfield Township property owners will be sent out today in a new attempt to stimulate tax payment.

MILLER UNDER FIRE Troy Township's Poor Relief Scrap

Supervisor Called "Dictator" As He Ignores Board's Move To Discharge Non-Resident Welfare Investigator

PROSECUTOR SUPPORTS HIS STAND

Although termed a "dictator" because of his policies of poor relief administration, and threatened with mass opposition at the polls in the coming spring election, Garner Miller, Troy Township supervisor, stood firm today in defense of his present welfare organization.

Troy Township's January Welfare Bill Was \$5,966

The total cost of poor relief for Troy Township for January was \$5,966.18, of which \$2,085.48 is chargeable to other townships and counties, making a net cost to Troy Township of \$3,880.70, according to a detailed report issued Wednesday by Supervisor Garner Miller and P. P. Quinn, welfare director.

BOARD Drops ASHER

At a meeting Tuesday the Township Board voted unanimously to discontinue Asher's services and to accept the resignation of P. P. Quinn as welfare director. Both Quinn and Asher were formerly employed as investigators by the Oakland County Poor Commission.

MILLER Ignores Resolution
