### GROSSE POINTE TRIPS MAPLES

Superior Height Gives Millionaires 23-17 Cages Conquest

Advantage in height was the factor that enabled the Grosse Pointe High School basketball team to defeat the Baldwin High School quintet last Friday night in the first game of the state elimination series. The Maples, making their third consecutive appearance on a foreign field, were triumphed by a count of 23 to 17.

In contrast to the exceptionally diminutive Baldwin team was the unusually large Grosse Pointe squad, and although the Maples played as good basketball during the entire game as the Pointers did, they lost all advantage in being outjumped on follow-up shots and tip off plays.

The Millionaires' superiority was in height, yet the shortest man on their team was the star of the game, Ed Wernet, Grosse Pointe captain and forward, was not only high point scorer of the game with seven points, but also started with his good passing and defense work.

Both teams were the victims of poor officiating. Grosse Pointe had a "block" play which enabled them to score easily, and when the officiating was poor, it worked properly, this play is legal, but the manner in which it was used, especially night brought the indignant Baldwin rosters to their feet in protest.

But Grosse Pointe was not especially favored by the officials, who were making their first appearance in a game in which eight Grosse Pointe or Birmingham participated. Several of the plainest fouls committed by the Maroons remained uncalled, and some that seemed questionable by the audience were called.

The second half was not as fast as the first, although better ball was played by both teams. Schwartz put the Maroons in the lead at the opening of the third quarter by sinking a shot from the double line.
