### Action Nearing On Speed Limit Fight; Raise Fines

More immediate action in the angle parking system fight they may be expected in the near future, indications were yesterday. Municipal Judge Forbes H. Hascall prepared to levy heavier fines against offenders and police were not releasing their campaign ordered by the City Commission to catch speeders.

Chief John Hackett nor Judge Hascall favor either the angle parking of the 30-mile speed limit which prevails from Oakland avenue to Brown street on Woodward avenue. But both are bound by a Commission resolution. To date Judge Hascall has been assessing only nominal fines in speeding cases and police have been turning all offenders over to him for trial. But, in an effort to bring the matter to a head, the justice plans to begin shortly to levy fines of \$5 and \$10 as provided for in the code drawn up by the police department and approved by the Commission.

"I am fineing presoners only the nominal fines now because I am sure they are not, in most cases, aware of the recent side of Woodward from Maple to Willis street. A check showed that the greatest number of cars parked in this area in a single day, by the angle parking system, was 21. The area is spaced out so that 24 cars park there by the parallel system, the chief says.

No action was taken at Monday night's Commission meeting regarding the letter sent Mayor Harry Allen by H. O. Rounds, director of the safety and traffic of Michigan. Although the letter lay in front of the mayor through out the session, he had not read when a movement for adjournment was proposed.
