

Commission Approves New Schedule Of Traffic Fines

If you are arrested in Birmingham for, say, driving through a red light or parking next to a fire hydrant, you can be absolutely sure of what the fine is going to be even before you know what the desk sergeant has to say.

The City Commission Monday night approved a schedule of fines

for all traffic violations as submitted by Chief of Police John P. Hackett, after adopting an amendment to the traffic ordinance.

The amendment provides for the establishment of a Traffic Violations Bureau where the schedule of fines will be inflexible whenever the violator elects to settle there rather than take his case to justice court. The person in charge of the Bureau may demand, however, that any case be taken to court if he sees fit.

Old Schedule Obsolete
The police department here has conducted a Traffic Violations Bureau for several years, but its establishment was by resolution. A set schedule of fines has also become obsolete with numerous changes in the speed limit on Woodward avenue.

These are the fines under the new schedule:
Driving on Woodward avenue north of Oak street or south of Lincoln avenue from one to five miles an hour in excess of the 45 mile speed limit—\$5. From six to 10 miles above the limit—\$10. Driving in any other portion of the city from one to 10 miles in excess of speed limit—\$5. From 11 to 20 miles above the limit—\$10.
Any other speeding violations will go directly to the Municipal Court.

Other Fines
Failure to stop at stop street—\$1.
Failure to stop when driving out of an alley or driveway—\$1.
Running a red light—\$3.
Parking in a restricted zone—\$1.
Parking within 15 feet of a fire hydrant—\$2.
Parking on left side of the street—\$1.
Parking on a cross-walk—\$1.
Parking between the sidewalk and curb—\$1.
Double parking (look out for this one)—\$2.

And Still Others
Overtaking parking—\$1.
Driving with more than three persons in the driver's seat—\$1.
Driving without proper lights, either front or rear—\$2.
These penalties are applicable to first violations only. One dollar will be added to the fine for a second violation of the same nature within a year, and \$2 will be added for the third violation. Subsequent violations will be taken to court.
