

SOFT WATER PLANT URGED

Project Would Cut \$300,000 From Welfare Burden, Committee Estimates

The City Commission has under consideration today a recommendation from its special committee on consolidating public works projects that it take the proper steps "as early as possible" toward the erection of a water softening plant, the total cost of which is estimated at \$250,000.

eligibility for public works construction projects," the report on the water treatment plant said.

"Almost any needed public works can now count on not only securing necessary loans from the Federal Government but are assured a Federal grant amounting to a probable 30 per cent of the cost of the project and at a probable interest rate on the balance not to exceed 3 per cent. The Federal Government has not yet been definitely adopted and the detailed regulations are of course still undeveloped but the features of the bill clearly indicate that the above statement will be substantially the condition."

"As the first of its conclusions, the report declares that 'in regard to the water treatment plant for the City of Birmingham should provide iron removal and softening for all of the three deep wells serving the city. This would be accomplished by a main plant at the Lincoln well site consisting of mixing, sedimentation, ultrafiltration and storage capacity sufficient for the Lincoln and Baldwin wells, and a filter plant at the Derby well site."

"The Lincoln plant would meet all ordinary requirements and the Derby plant would be brought into use only during extraordinary summer peaks. This is only one of the general schemes which might be adopted as determined after a detailed engineering study. As a part of this plan, approximately two miles of arterial main would be required—on Lincoln from Southfield to Woodward and the new super-highway right-of-way to Oak street and an 8-inch main connecting Baldwin and Lincoln wells."

Losses Terminated

As outlined in the report, the structure and plant at the Lincoln site would cost \$90,000 at the Derby site \$10,000, and main \$15,000, making a total cost of \$115,000. The report points out that engineering study might disclose more economical methods of construction.

By the total cost, the report shows, \$66,450 would be spent for labor. "The welfare budget for the next fiscal year is \$38,000," the report points out. "Depending somewhat upon the method of construction adopted it is probable that from \$25,000 to \$30,000 of this burden would be removed."
