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# State Board Refuses To Open Way For Renewal Of Cranbrook-Baldwin Games

A recent meeting of the Board of Control of the State Athletic Union, the Council refused the request made by Baldwin School and Cranbrook School that Cranbrook be allowed to regard state eligibility requirements in a proposed football game between the two schools.

The refusal which stands the well known to an attempt to renew athletic relations between the two schools, was made known by Melvin C. Hart of Baldwin, after he had received a letter stating the action of the Council from C. J. Prosser, director of high school athletics.

In former games with Baldwin, Cranbrook has been handicapped because of a ruling which prohibits boys who have been in school more than four years from competing against high school teams. When Cranbrook plays other prep schools and college freshmen teams these boys are allowed to participate.
