Little Symphony Program Lists "Rhapsody in Blue"

Gerahwin Composition To Be Played At Community House Concert

George Gerahwin's "Rhapsody in Blue" will be played for a Birmingham audience by the Norman College Little Symphony Orchestra of Ypsilanti when it appears here in concert at the Community House Friday evening, March 27, according to the program released today by the conductor, Marjorie Fossenkemper.

While not often heard on the programs of young symphonists, the Ypsilanti musicians, under Mrs. Fossenkemper's direction, have performed the work, composed in 1923 and now considered of a leading place in the list of enduring modern compositions, numerous times with enviable success.

The orchestra's continuing contribution to the program will be Offenbach's overture to "Orpheus in the Underworld." The rest of the program will be given over to two solo performances.

The soloists will be George Bakerville, Danville, who will play Tchaikovsky's First Piano Concerto, and Emily Muntz, Adams, who will play the Bruch First Concerto for violin.

The conductor of the orchestra, Mrs. Fossenkemper, is a resident of Birmingham and holds the degree of instrumental music at Ypsilanti State Normal College two years ago.

A graduate of the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music, Earhart College, Richmond, Ind., and of the University of Cincinnati School of Music, he plays first clarinet in the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

THE MILLINGTON PLAN OF BANK STRUCTURE

1. By an act of Congress affecting all banks, all banks, whether members of the Federal Reserve, and all banks of the United States, shall be subject to the same Federal Reserve requirements for a condition for acceptance for membership.

2. Capital not less than \$100,000,000, divided into 10,000,000 shares of a value of \$10 each, each subject to double liability. This amount shall be the maximum amount that all banks shall become members of the Federal Reserve Bank.

3. This proposed Guaranty Bank should have the right of currency, to deposit government bonds with the Treasurer of the United States, and to issue national bank notes, and to have the right to issue and redeem the currency of the United States.

4. The current funds of the Guaranty Bank should be deposited with the Federal Reserve Bank, and all surplus funds must be invested in government bonds.
