Safe-guarding Your Deposits!

Business in the smaller communities. This reporter has had sufficient opportunity to observe recent banking activities, and he knows something of the workings of several kinds of them. America's banking structure is not its greatest asset. To control these "fisher" it will be necessary to set up, as part of the Federal (not State) machinery of government regulation, a system of GUARANTEED BANK DEPOSIT insurance that will actually save the greedy bankers from destroying themselves and their savings depositors.

Such a GUARANTEED DEPOSIT structure should not cost the United States Government a single penny in direct taxes, but should be shouldered by the banks themselves, with a huge pool of super-trust department, controlled directly by the Federal Government. Any GUARANTEED DEPOSIT plan that proposes to place another tax upon the government is a foolishness for the simple reason that if you try to make the Federal Government responsible for the mistakes of one or more bank depositors and super-trust departments, it provides the definition only set up another "feeding station" on the already too heavily bogged-down of Federal Treasury.

For a long time this reporter has been interested in the GUARANTEED DEPOSIT structure proposed by a local citizen, Theodore H. Millington, of East Lake, Lake Road, Bloomfield Hills. Mr. Millington has had many years of experience in business, and is a student of modern banking practices. Briefly, Mr. Millington's plan would set up a National Guaranty Fund similar to the present Federal Reserve System, in this National Guaranty Fund each member bank to deposit a very small percentage of its deposits in the form of United States Government Bonds. This huge reserve would be kept in liquid form to be used in any manner that insurance agencies are managed for life or property protection. This fund would be allowed to earn regular interest for lending aid, but not with the flexibility and ease of handling that the present Federal Reserve System has.

The President would be empowered to appoint a Board of Governors for the proposed National Guaranty Deposit Fund. By special Act of Congress, such a financial structure can be created. Mr. Millington's plan is a simple one. It can be projected from Washington. Since guaranty insurance is carried on among the member banks; by virtue of the trust power vested in the Board of the National Guaranty Deposit Fund could close any bank whose operations were in any way of whose officers had by any
