The Board of Trustees of the Michigan State Normal School, in its annual report for the year ending June 30, 1933, has set forth a plan for re-opening the school for the fall term of 1933-34.

A definite statement as to the details of the plan under consideration for the re-opening of the Michigan State Normal School for the fall term of 1933-34, will be made available to depositors by the board on Tuesday, it was indicated today.

Charles E. James, a former director who was appointed conservator of the bank by the U. S. Government, has completed their examination of the condition of the bank, and has reported to the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago.

The report should be in the hands of the National Bank Examiner of the Seventh District in Chicago by the latter part of this week, it was announced today.

It is possible that owing to the rush of business at the Chicago office, Mr. Leyburn, Chief National Bank Examiner for the District, will postpone the appointment for several days.

According to a statement issued by the directors last week, the plan which was presented by a committee of the directors, and which has been tentatively approved by the Department of the Comptroller of the Currency, Mr. James' appointment as conservator was the first step in the plan of the bank.
