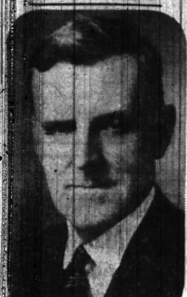
LUTHER HEACOCK

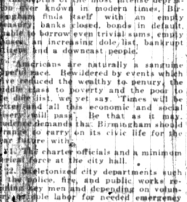
ARTHUR J. TUGUEY

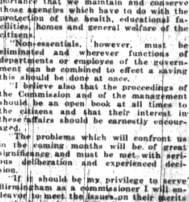
A. J. BRANDT

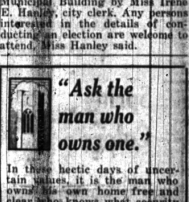
T. R. SMITH

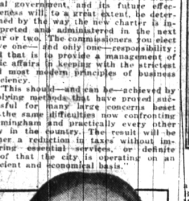
FRANK S. PACKARD

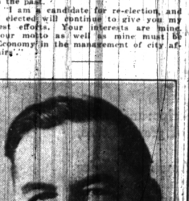

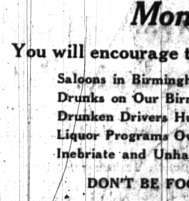
