BOARD IGNORES TAX BUREAU'S PETITION

The Board of Education made no move last Thursday night to grant the request of the Michigan Tax Adjustment Bureau for a recommendation to act as an agent in dealing in Birmingham school bonds under the bonds-for-taxes plan. Failure to act on the request, which had been presented a month before, was construed as meaning it had been tabled indefinitely.

To date, only Cutler, Moeller and Hobbie, Inc., have received the Board's recommendation for engaging in the bonds-for-taxes negotiations.

MEAT LOAF
3 lbs. lean beef 1 1/2 onion juice
1/2 lb. fat salt pork 1/2 salt
2 cups fine dry bread 1/2 cup pepper
crumbs 1/2 cup milk
2 eggs

Put thru a meat grinder with the salt pork. Mix with bread crumbs, eggs, onion juice, salt, pepper and milk to make a stiff batter. Sprinkle buttered oblong baking dish with crumbs, then put in batter. Unmold when ready to serve.
