MENU HINTS Luncheon Rice Cakes With Cheese. Fresh or Stewed Fruit. Cookies or Cup Cakes. Milk. Dessert Rabbit or Chicken With Peach Garnish. Mashed Potatoes. Squash. Apple-Celery Salad. Nuts. Coffee.

Today's Recipes Rice Cakes With Cheese, Dutch Style.—One and one-half cups boiled rice, one-fourth teaspoon lemon juice, one-fourth teaspoon paprika, one-third cup flour, four tablespoons fat. Mix rice and seasonings. Shape into cakes and roll in flour. Heat fat in frying pan and add cakes, allowing them to brown on each side.

Rabbit With Peach Garnish.—Clean and wash rabbit well. Soak in salted water for 20 minutes. Rinse and wipe dry. Stuff with following dressing: Mix together two cups mashed potatoes, one cup bread crumbs, three tablespoons chopped, cooked carrots, one teaspoon chopped parsley, one fourth teaspoon of sage, one teaspoon of celery salt, two tablespoons melted butter, one teaspoon chopped onion, one well beaten egg and one tablespoon of cream. Bake in covered pan until tender. Chop onion, mix with bacon or other fat. Sprinkle with salt, and serve on a hot platter surrounded by heated peaches. Thicken gravy and serve in a separate dish. This dressing can also be used for chicken or other fowl.

STROKE FATAL TO HORTICULTURIST

Funeral To Be Held Friday For George C. Baldwin, 30, Of Big Beaver

Funeral services will be held Friday for George C. Baldwin, widely known Big Beaver horticulturist and political leader, who died Wednesday morning in St. Joseph Mercy Hospital, following a stroke.

He was 30 years old, and had lived in Big Beaver for nine years. He resided at 1855 Meadowcrest avenue. His farm, where he raised quantities of flowers which he sold to wholesalers, was one of the landmarks in Big Beaver. He always took an active part in political campaigns, although never holding office himself.

He was born in Capac, Mich., and came to Big Beaver after living several years in Detroit. Surviving are his widow, Mary Baldwin; two sons, George Edward, seven years old, and Kenneth John, four weeks, and the mother, Mrs. Augusta Baldwin of Big Beaver.

The body will be at the G. Dewey Kimball Funeral Parlors here until Friday noon. Services will be held at 1 P. M. from the Big Beaver M. E. Church. Burial will be in Capac.

Firm Would Deal In Schools' Bonds

Tax Adjustment Association Asks To Participate In Bonds-Fort Taxes Scheme

The Michigan Tax Adjustment Association, through its secretary, J. D. Stanton, has asked the Board of Education for permission to deposit school district bonds in payment of school taxes.

When the latter firm was given its authorization, the Board passed a resolution making it necessary for each individual firm desiring to deal in the bonds to obtain the Board's sanction. Mr. Stanton asked the Board last Thursday night to take a resolution offered by him which would give his company that sanction, but John S. Black and E. E. McKinley, trustees, were appointed to reconcile the terms of this resolution with the one passed by the Board, before the authorization will be granted.

The Michigan Tax Adjustment Association, Mr. Stanton said, is handling bonds-for-taxes negotiations for several municipalities in the Detroit metropolitan area. He has deposited \$400 in city bonds with the Board of Education, Birmingham city treasurer. Although Cutler, Moeller and Hubble is the only firm which has received formal endorsement of the Birmingham Commission, other firms and individuals are permitted to deposit bonds under the terms of the city's resolution.
