KINDNESS TURNS TO ILL FORTUNE

Pontiac Woman, 60, Injured in Crash With Motorist Offering Her A "Lift"

Offered a ride by a passing motorist who thought she "looked no forlorn" Mrs. Hattie McKim, 60 years old, of 228 State Street, Pontiac, was badly cut about the face Friday when the motorist, also a woman, crashed into three automobiles in a peculiar accident on North Woodward avenue in front of the postoffice.

The motorist, Mrs. William C. Pfeifer, 14145 St. Mary's avenue, Detroit, had driven only a few yards with the passenger she had picked up at Oakland avenue when she struck a car parked at the curb in charge of Mrs. Harold Prussing, 425 Bryn Mawr drive.

Then she hit another car at the curb driven by Mrs. R. J. Roy, 374 Wellwood drive. Striking a third car as it was backing out from the curb, driven by Mrs. L. J. Jeffers, 979 Chesterfield road, Mrs. Pfeifer's car finally ended its wild journey against the curb on the other side of the street.

Mrs. Pfeifer was uninjured, but Mrs. McKim was thrown against the windshield and suffered severe lacerations on the forehead, nose and chin. Twelve stitches were taken in the wounds by Dr. C. F. Lawler.

Neither Mrs. Pfeifer nor Mrs. McKim was able to tell how the accident happened. The driver was not held, but her husband offered to pay for the damages to the other cars and for Mrs. McKim's injuries.

Mrs. McKim had come to Birmingham in an unsuccessful search for house work which was on her way home when Mrs. Pfeifer offered her a ride, and Mrs. Pfeifer said she was driving Mrs. McKim up because she felt sorry for her after other cars had passed her by.
