Howarth, chairman of the NRA Compliance Board, are planning to attend a meeting of the Oakland Area Recovery Committee in Pontiac at 10 A. M. Friday, called for the purpose of discussing the establishment of trade areas as contemplated in the President's re-employment agreement.

According to George H. Kimball, Jr., secretary of the Oakland Area Committee, these trade areas have not yet been determined for Oakland County. "The determination of this matter is still an open question," Mr. Kimball said, "and it is hoped that the decision can be made by a friendly co-operative discussion between the merchants of the several towns of the county." The meeting will be held in the offices of the Pontiac Board of Commerce.
