2 MEN FINED IN HILLS COURT AS DISORDERLY

THREE OVER WEEKEND
Woman, 4 Men Arraigned Here On Liquor, Traffic Charges
Although no accidents were reported, week-end hilarity resulted in the arrest here of a drunk driver, a reckless driver, and three other persons, including a woman, for being drunk. All five were arraigned Monday morning before Justice Forbes S. Hascall.
Wilma Lafferty, 32 years old, an unemployed waitress with no home, was sentenced to 30 days in jail, with the understanding that she would leave the county. She pleaded guilty to the charge of driving with W. M. Schenkel, 29, of 353 Seward street, Pontiac, as they were sitting in a car parked on Woodward avenue at Greenwood avenue.
Both were charged with being drunk and disorderly. Officers found a bottle partly filled with liquor in the car. Schenkel was placed on probation for 30 days and ordered to pay \$15 costs within two weeks.
Charles Kokotek, 45-year-old, Charlie trimmer of 204 Elm street, Pontiac, was given the choice of paying a \$50 fine and \$5 costs or spending 10 days in jail for drunk driving. CITY ENJOYING HEALTHY YEAR
Past Winter Shows Marked Decrease in Number of Contagious Cases
Contagious diseases have been less prevalent in Birmingham during the past winter than in any other season in the city's history, records of the city health department show.
Following the trend of the last several months of 1933, during which the community was singularly free from contagion, records for the first three months of 1934 show that only 20 cases of communicable diseases were quarantined or placarded here as compared with 206 in the same period last year and 1032 the year before.
From Jan. 1 to April 1, this year, there were only 12 cases of scarlet fever, as compared with the same year in 1932 and 40 in 1933. Not a single case of mumps or typhoid fever was reported in the first three months of 1934, and only one case of whooping cough. Whooping cough and typhoid fever both quite prevalent in 1933 and 1932, and the incidence of measles was exceptionally high last year during the past two winters. Despite the sharp decrease in contagious cases in the first three months of 1934, the outbreak here of a lone case of typhoid fever, Birmingham's first in three years, William Lloyd Kemp characterized the past winter as the healthiest he has known since becoming city health officer in 1920, but was unable to give any particular reason to account for it.
There has been no marked decrease in contagion in any other part of the county, he said, except in measles, which occurs in two-year cycles, last year being a peak year. In the county as a whole, incidence of scarlet fever in March was about the same as in the corresponding month last year, he said, whereas that of whooping cough increased about 2 to 1.

Softball Loop For Young Boys Planned
Organization of a softball league for boys up to and including 14 years of age was announced this week by Irwin W. Neff, Jr., director of the Birmingham Boy's Club.
The league will probably be composed of six or eight teams and the first games will be played in about two weeks, Neff said. The season will continue to the middle of June, with games being played Friday afternoons and Saturday mornings.
Places will be found for all members of the club who wish to play, and non-members may also join the league, Neff said.

BLAZE DAMAGES TRUCK
Possible serious damage was averted last Thursday morning when gasoline caught fire as it was flowing through a hose from a truck into a pump at Hall's Garage, Humphrey and Woodward streets. The blaze was extinguished with no damage except to a seat cushion in the truck.

SUIT ASKS RETURN OF \$40,000 TAXES
Double Assessment Claimed in Action Against Birmingham, Hills and Township
The Cities of Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills and Bloomfield Township are named joint defendants in a suit filed in Circuit Court last Thursday by the Maple Cranbrook Corporation for recovery of approximately \$40,000 in taxes and interest.
The suit is the outgrowth of an alleged double assessment of property belonging to the corporation at the corner of West Maple and Lahner roads, formerly the John Mercier Farm.
The suit sets forth that, in 1929, the township assessed the property on a tax roll for \$24,000.05 in taxes, and in the same year also assessed 200 lots in Bloomfield Village, constituting one corner of the same property, for \$4,157.71. The suit asks that the total of the taxes, which were paid, be returned, plus interest at 6 per cent. Judson Bradway was president and treasurer of the Maple Cranbrook Corporation.
