Manresa May Get Birmingham Water

Commission Instructs Manager To Drive Up Contract With Retreat For Final Approval

The Commission Monday night instructed City Manager James W. Parry to draw up a contract with officials of Manresa, Catholic laymen's retreat at Quaton road and Woodward avenue, for connecting the retreat with Birmingham's city water supply.

The main building at Manresa was destroyed by fire several weeks ago, but is to be rebuilt, and the Rev. Fr. W. E. Cogley, the director, had asked for an estimate of the cost of its being supplied with Birmingham water. The retreat lies in Bloomfield Hills, just beyond the Birmingham city limits.

The Commission appeared favorable to the proposal, and asked Mr. Parry to submit the contract for final approval when it is drawn up. The manager said it would be based on a contract now in existence with the Birmingham Golf Club, which also lies outside the city limits, and which paid the cost of installing connections with city mains and is paying double the regular rate for its water supply from Birmingham.

He estimated that Manresa would require an average of about 30 gallons of water a month, and assured the Commission this would in no way impair the local supply.

Troy Township Lad Receives Fatal Injuries On Homeward Walk

Funeral services were held Monday afternoon for Donald Arthur Wright, six-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur W. Wright, of 1935 Big Beaver road, near Crooks road, who received fatal injuries when struck by an automobile while walking home from school Friday afternoon.

The car was driven by Elmer Schroeder, a Big Beaver automobile dealer, who told officers he drove into a ditch in an attempt to avoid striking the boy, who walked directly into the path of his car. The boy died a few minutes later in the office of Dr. Fred T. Reid of Clawson.

Donald was a first grade student in the Poppleton School, and was walking with a schoolmate on Big Beaver road near Crooks road when the accident occurred.

Besides his parents, he is survived by two sisters, Irene and Mildred, and by a brother, Eldon. His father is a truck gardener.

The services were held from the S. O. Wylie Bell Funeral Home here, with burial in Crooks Cemetery.
