

Wing Lake Student Wins District Spelling Crown

To a tiny one-room district school will go the honor of furnishing the representative of the Birmingham-Bloomfield district in this year's annual Detroit Metropolitan Spelling Bee.

Eleven-year-old Barbara Fawcett, a student in the sixth grade at Wing Lake School, won the district contest held Friday afternoon at Barnum School by spelling down 12 opponents, all champions of their respective schools.

Barbara, who is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Addison Fawcett, won on the word "venturous," which Dorothy McCormick, an eighth grade student at Barnum School and the last of Barbara's opponents to arrive, missed when she put an "e" before the "o." Dorothy is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Frank McCormick, 728 West Lincoln avenue.

Barbara and Dorothy spelled steadily for half an hour before the latter finally went down. It had taken nearly an hour to eliminate the other 11 spellers.

First to go down was Robert Peck, of Feroc School, who missed in the first round on "serviceable." In the next round, Barbara Curtis, of the Bloomfield Hills School, was eliminated on "raising." John Stuart, of Linton School, tripped on "comman," and Marie Black, of Tuscarora
