**Truck Robberies Increasing Some Travel In Convoys Now Torture Abroad—And Here**

NEW YORK, Aug. 30.—The robbery of an armored truck in New York with \$427,000, is sensational, of course. Readers may be surprised to learn, however, that loss from truck robberies reaches a nation-wide total of six figures every month. The other robberies are of silk trucks, of cigar trucks, of liquor trucks.

**Attendance For Eight Weeks Was 29,936; Rain Spoils Field Day**  
The city's FERA summer recreation program enjoyed a total attendance of 29,936 for the eight-week period, according to the final report of Miss Miriam Brown, general supervisor. The program closed Friday. A disheartening rain in the morning forced cancellation of a community-wide play day which had been scheduled for the farm school playground, and in which 500 local children were to have taken part. The swimming pool was left open on the usual schedule. It was the first time throughout the entire eight weeks that rain had interfered with any of the playground activities.

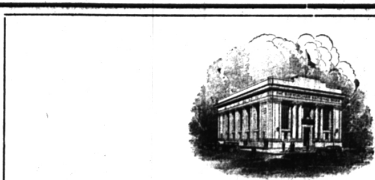
**Machines of All-Work**
