

BALL GAMES START MONDAY

Post-Season Competition Is Scheduled To Decide Cup Competitors

Post-season softball activities will begin Monday, Aug. 13, when the two Birmingham leagues stage an elimination series to decide who will participate in the Championship Cup series to be played the following week.

Final standings in their respective leagues still depend in some instances on the games yet to be played to complete the schedule which finishes this week.

In the Twilight division, the status of Williams Boot Shop, Mulholland, and Fuel Oil depends on the final games. These teams constitute the leading three teams but the order cannot safely be predicted.

Franklin finished in first place in the Commercial League by defeating South End with whom they were deadlocked Monday night. South End dropped to second place and Eastern Michigan and Pecks are tied for third place.

The schedule for the elimination series starting Monday night is as follows:

Monday—The first team in the Commercial division vs. the first team in the Twilight division on Poppleton field No. 2. The second place team of the one division vs. the second place team of the other division on Poppleton No. 1.

Tuesday—The first place teams again play on Poppleton field No. 1 and the third place teams play on Poppleton No. 2.

Wednesday—Second place teams play on Poppleton No. 2 and third place teams play on Poppleton No. 1.

Thursday—Games necessary to break ties will be played.

The championship series will start Monday, Aug. 20, when the winners of second and third place elimination series will battle for the privilege of meeting the winner of the first place series the following week.

vent all the present human catastrophes," he said.

Criticizes Political Parties
Touching upon American political parties, Reverend Aulenbach strongly criticized the policy of each party lying and running down the opposition merely to promote its own interests when not in office.

"More bloodshed, strife, turmoil, and possibly civil war are in store for us unless political parties cease their unwarranted criticisms and undermining of what constructive work is being done," he stated.

It is the duty of opposing groups to call attention to what they believe to be errors of the party in power, he said, but it will lead to the rapid disintegration of this nation for any party to deliberately lie about the other merely to obtain its own ends.

Doubts Freedom of the Press
Freedom of the press continues to be a myth in Reverend Aulenbach's eyes as long as partisan groups continue to "stupidly, indiscreetly, and unadvisedly print partisan opinions in the papers which they control, without regard for the truth."

The American attitude toward law was interpreted by Reverend Aulenbach as being a deliberate attempt to isolate restrictions, and the belief that "one cannot be honest and succeed in business."

"Perhaps the function of President Roosevelt has been to take us to school," he said in conclusion, and what we learn depends on the new dealers ability to teach and convince. But, whether we accept it all or not, it has taught us much, and the ideals it has presented are in our minds to stay."

CIRCULATION IN LIBRARY DROPS

Noticeable Decline Seen in Number Of Books Taken Out During July

Circulation of books at Baldwin Library during the month of July showed a drop of 764 as compared to the circulation during the same period last year, according to the monthly report of the library which has just been issued.

In July, 1933, 6,519 books were circulated, while in July of this year the total dropped to 5,755. Figures on registration show that on June 30 there were 5,043 in the register, and since that time there have been 52 new adult registrations, 21 juvenile, and 3 non-resident. However, withdrawal of 67 registrations left the final total on July 31 at 5,052.

The library contained 13,152 books on July 1 of this year, and this figure was increased by 87 throughout the month, bringing the total on July 31 to 13,239. Of the new books, 1 was purchased, 41 added by gift, and the remaining 45 taken from the rental collection.

ISSUE WARNING TO LOCAL VOTERS

Residents Given Until August 22 To Inform City Clerk of New Addresses

Because of the numerous changes that have taken place in Birmingham residents' home addresses during the past few months, a reminder was issued by City Clerk Irene Hanley yesterday urging all voters to see that their registrations are properly located in order to prevent any difficulty at the polls in September, by reporting address changes to her at the Municipal Building.

Aug. 22 is the last day for doing this.

This is mainly true when families move from one precinct to another. Miss Hanley explained for at the time an election is held it will be necessary for voters to ballot in their resident precinct, and if they have moved without reporting it considerable confusion and inconvenience are likely to result.

When notices of new addresses are received the cards for the voters are transferred to their new precincts. It was suggested that voters also acquaint themselves with the location of their voting booths.

OUR YESTERDAYS When Alcock and Brown Completed The First Flight Across Atlantic



ALMOST as important to the progress of aviation as the first flight of the Wright brothers was the epoch flight of Capt. John Alcock and Lieutenant Arthur W. Brown from the Newfoundland coast to Ireland, on June 13-14, 1919—the first journey across the Atlantic ocean by airplane. The record of the flight shows it was one of the most hazardous ever undertaken, before or since, for the flyers were forced to battle fog and storms during most of the hop. They accomplished the feat in an old type plane with a crude instrument board and unequipped with radio—a plane that few flyers today would care to take on such a perilous journey.
