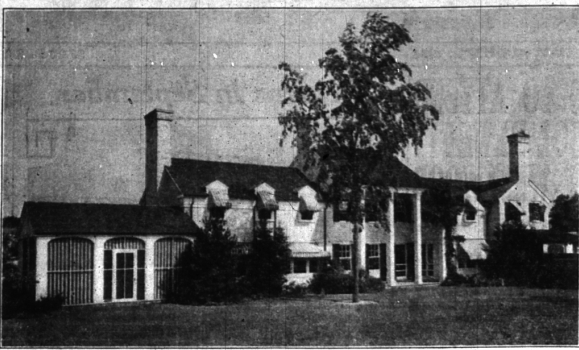


Shooting, Attempted Holdup Investigated
