### WOMEN'S RIGHTS SUBJECT OF TALK

Speaker Discusses Means of Removing Discriminations Embodied in Law

Legal and economic discriminations against women, and means proposed for their removal formed the subject of an address by Mrs. Walter Nelson of Detroit, executive secretary for the National Women's Party, before members of the Birmingham League of Women Voters at the Community House Monday afternoon.

Mrs. Nelson traced the history of the proposed "Lucretia Mott Amendment" to the Constitution, which, if adopted, would effect a blanket removal of all such discriminations throughout the country. She also discussed the plan proposed for state action, by which changes in laws affecting women could be made only by the legislative bodies of the respective states.

Scottish songs and carols were sung last year in the interest of the proposed amendment, which will be presented to the next Congress.
