

CHAS. B. BOOTH TO SPEAK HERE

Secretary Of Volunteers Of America Will Address Father-Son Banquet

Charles Brandon Booth, only son of General Ballington Booth and Mrs. Maud Ballington Booth, founders and co-commanders of the Volunteers of America, has been secured as the speaker for the community Father and Son banquet to be held at the Community House Feb. 22 under the auspices of the Birmingham Y. M. C. A. It has been announced by Robert D. Lynd, secretary.

Mr. Booth, with a background of 26 years of social and religious service, is well-fitted to tell an intimate story of the present day opportunities for service to humanity.

Beginning his apprenticeship in the chosen field of three generations of his illustrious family under the guidance of his mother, the "Little Mother" of the prison world, and his famous father, he has devoted his life to the understanding of human nature, whether it be in prison work, emergency or relief work, in fresh-air camps, homes for the aged, or for children, hospitals, public dispensaries or any of the numerous branches of work conducted by the Volunteers of America, of which he is the national extension secretary.

He has addressed millions of people from coast to coast, winning the reputation of being one of the foremost lecturers of his day. His messages are illustrated by vivid stories of life as his great organization has found it, and by a personality that has endeavored him to the hearts of church, club, school and college audiences all over the country. The subject of his address here will be "We Partners."
