Garments Donated
In the past year, garments given out through the Community House were as follows: Red Cross, 4,500; Needlework Guild, 2,085; the House of Clothes press, 2,850 pieces of used garments donated by townspeople. In addition, 1,500 cans of food donated by school children and employees of the Michigan Bell Telephone Company were sent out in emergency boxes. Under the supervision of Mrs. E. G. Hatch, sewing groups on Monday and Tuesday completed 3,600 garments, made layettes and mended old garments. At times when the House did not have specific garments needed, the Trading Post supply was offered. The houses' report, given also by Mrs. Wall, showed that the attendance record for the year was 5,545, as compared with 65,216 in 1932. During 1933 the House prepared for 210 meetings of civic and business organizations and 40 dancing parties. The report of the employment office, submitted by Mrs. W. Trumbull, who has been in charge for the last two months, shows that for the past year 2,850 telephone calls were received, 712 applications for work were taken, and 321 interviews arranged. Jobs were found for 182 maids, 38 catenaries and waitresses, 20 male day workers, 341 female day workers, two second maids, three in-home seamstresses, 19 part-time workers, and 10 permanent laundresses. The report stated that two children have been placed in boarding houses. If lists placed in boarding houses by lists of names have been given out, rooms have been rented, night lodgings have been furnished and several persons have been placed to care for children. Approximately 30 persons attended the meeting, at which no mention was made of last New Year's Eve party and the resulting charges of intoxication and boisterousness.
