### RED WINGS WIN SOFTBALL TILT

Hockey Champs Edge Williams' In Exhibition Here, 7 to 6

The Detroit Red Wings are champions of the National Hockey League, and they also know a thing or two about another game—softball—which can't claim much relationship to the puck-chasing sport.

They demonstrated this to the satisfaction of a couple of hundred Birmingham fans Monday evening on Poppleton field when they took the measure of the Williams' Boot Shop team in an exhibition game, 7 to 6. Williams' is one of the leading organizations in the Birmingham softball league.

The game, which was arranged by Louis J. Giffels, a Birmingham resident who manages the Detroit Olympia, where the Red Wings play their home hockey games, brought to town some of the world's cleverest of hockey-stick wielders—including Eddie Goodfellow, Tip Foster, Larry Aurie, Ronnie Moffatt, Tommy Ross and others. George Day, one-time Red Wing forward and manager of the Detroit Olympia, was also in the lineup.

**Foster Stars**

Foster was the shining light in the Red Wings' attack. Besides pitching the first six innings, during which he held the opposition to six hits and five runs, the clutch pitcher threw two singles, a double and a home run in four trips to the plate. Williams' might have won had Red Miller, who started in the box for the locals, been allowed to finish the game. He held the Wings scoreless for four innings, but after weakening in the fifth, when he gave two hits and two runs, he was replaced by Gus Clauw. The stakers hopped onto Clauw's offerings for three runs in the sixth, and after Williams' had tied the count in their half of the seventh, the Wings put over two more to win in the extra eighth inning.

Throughout the game, the Wings displayed the same fine sportsmanlike spirit which made them international favorites on the ice last winter and won friends galore among their Birmingham audience, despite the outcome of the game.

Following the tilt, the distinguished visitors expressed their satisfaction to Jimmy Drumm, Williams' manager, for the way things were handled, and promised to come back again for another game whenever arrangements can be made.

**Williams' Score First**

Williams' started the scoring in the first inning when Rochechou doubled and came in on Harris' single, the latter scoring later on a sacrifice after stealing third.

The Wings tied the count in the fifth, which Moffatt opened with a single, Johnny Neuman also singled, and both runners came in on a wild pitch and a sacrifice. Then, in the sixth, Clauw's first inning on the mound, the Detroiters forged ahead by scoring three runs. Steele, first up, filed to Diemer in center, but Foster followed with his circuit cut and Hay got a three-bagger. Hay scored on a single by Aurie, who was later forced at second on Moffatt's grounder. Neuman rolled to winchell to end the inning.
