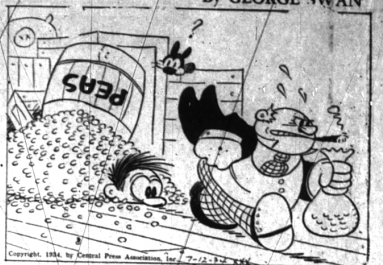

## Memories Of Crash Victims Still Blank

**Miss Chalmers Remembers Nothing Of Accident In Which She Was Injured**

Questioning of Peggy Chalmers, Bloomfield Hills society girl, Tuesday failed to uncover any new facts regarding the accident June 17, in which the late Edward J. Hammond, Jr., also of Bloomfield Hills, was seriously injured. It was announced yesterday by Assistant Prosecutor Franklin E. Morris.

Miss Chalmers had recovered sufficiently to be able to be moved Saturday from Sunnybrook Hospital, Royal Oak, to her home on Franklin road, where Mr. Morris talked with her Tuesday. He said, however, that her mind seems to be even more of a blank so far as the accident is concerned than Hammond's, and that Hammond is even unable to recall some things that happened as much as two days before the crash.

When Mr. Morris also talked again Tuesday, was removed to his home at Kensington road two weeks ago from Royal Oak Private Hospital.

Mr. Morris said he would probably wait at least a week or 10 days before calling a coroner's inquest. George Hammond, Edward's younger brother, who was less seriously hurt in the accident, is also hazy about the details. Mr. Morris said. He reported that his brother was driving at a moderate rate of speed, but Hammond's mind seems to be even more of a blank so far as the accident is concerned than Hammond's, and that Hammond is even unable to recall some things that happened as much as two days before the crash.

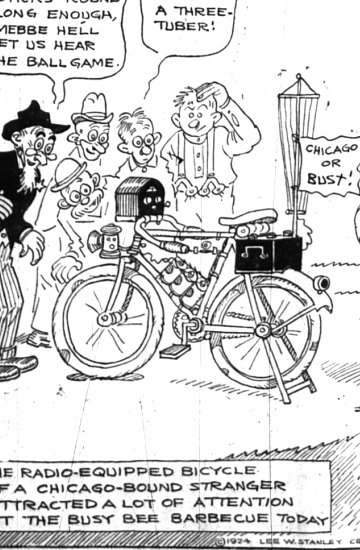
