STATE AMENDMENTS DISCUSSED BY VLIET

Arguments for and against three proposed state constitutional amendments to be voted on in Michigan this fall were outlined for Birmingham Rotarians at their meeting in the Community House Monday noon by Clarence Vliet, member of the City Commission and the Oakland County Board of Supervisors.

The three amendments include one enabling counties to adopt their own form of government, another to reduce the gasoline tax, and a third to revise the tax laws to enable the Legislature to assess differential tax rates on different kinds of property, with a view to further reducing the burden on real estate. Mr. Vliet discussed the amendments impartially, without taking a stand either for or against them.
