Mr. Velsey is the son of Mrs. Louis Weisenburger of Indianapolis, Ind. Miss Millington and Mr. Velsey were married in Kentucky Mar. 17.

Mr. Velsey, who has been spending some time with her parents, left Friday to join her husband in Dayton. Later she plans to spend a portion of the summer at the home of her husband's mother in Indianapolis. The romance of Mr. and Mrs. Velsey began several years ago when both were students of Lorelei Taft, noted sculptor, at the Institute of Arts in Chicago.
