5 MARRIED WOMEN TEACHERS RESIGN

Vacancies To Be Filled By Instructors Formerly On Half-Time Schedules

The resignations of five married women teachers in the Birmingham schools were accepted last Thursday night by the Board of Education. Superintendent Charles W. Crandell, who recommended acceptance of the resignations, said the teachers gave no reasons for their move. The five are: Mrs. Elfreda Webster, kindergarten teacher at Adams School; Mrs. Orpha Moshimer, second grade at Adams School; Mrs. Paula Hartman, sixth grade at Pierce School; Mrs. Marion Robinson, fourth grade at Pierce School; and Mrs. Care W. Daring, history teacher at Baldwin High School. Three of the five had been teaching full-time, and the other two half-time.

Probably no new teachers will be required to fill the vacancies, Mr. Crandell said. In accordance with a recent resolution of the Board, he was instructed to fill the vacancies, as far as possible, by putting other married women teachers, who have been teaching half-time, on full-time schedules. The resolution was designed to eliminate half-time positions as soon as possible.

The resolution provides that women teachers who marry will be dropped from the staff at the end of one semester, and that no new teachers will be hired except men. Under the former system, women teachers who married were automatically placed on half-time schedules.

The Board authorized Mr. Crandell at the meeting Thursday to mail-out contracts to be signed by the teachers for the coming year.

He Seeks Office Of Register Of Deeds

Raymond E. Addis, Holly real estate and insurance agent, has announced his candidacy for the Republican nomination for Oakland County register of deeds at the September primaries.

Mr. Addis was born in Holly Township in 1898, and was graduated from Holly High School in 1915. He studied engineering at Michigan State College and served in the United States Army during the World War. He has been in the real estate and insurance business in Holly since 1920.

For Senator Bulkeley, of Ohio, precipitated an uproar in the closing hours of Congress by trying to put the bill through. He did not succeed.

Senator Robert Bulkeley evidently is a puzzle to the Roosevelt administration. He is known as a Roosevelt man. Yet, when the stock exchange contract act was in committee, Senator Bulkeley seemed about as energetic as Senator Carter Glass, of Virginia, to protect the Wall Street Trust. Later, Senator Bulkeley presented some stringent amendments—but that was on the floor of the Senate.

Back in the days when two large Cleveland banks closed (never to reopen) because of irregularities, a Central Press writer presented facts of those irregularities to Senator Bulkeley.

"Those are serious charges to make," he said. And that ended that.

Nor was there ever an open Senate committee hearing of the Cleveland banking debacle—even though grand juries later indicted bankers, politicians, and manipulators.

The belief prevails in Cleveland that persons have been shielded, that all has not been told.

Yet Senator Bulkeley has nothing to fear. That's why the puzzle is all the greater.

C. R. GODFREY NAMED POOR COMMISSIONER

Charles R. Godfrey, former president and commissioner of Clawson, was selected county poor commissioner Monday by the Board of Supervisors to fill out the unexpired term of Carl H. Peterson. Peterson resigned June 2 to become city manager of Muskegon. Godfrey, recently an investigator for the County Poor Commission, was chosen from a group of five candidates. Two ballots were necessary before the required 29 votes, constituting a majority, were registered for Godfrey.
