Two Meetings Called For Discussion Of Township Settlement

Two meetings for discussion of the detailed plan submitted by Harry S. Starr for division of the joint assets and liabilities of Birmingham, Bloomfield Hills and Bloomfield Township, are scheduled for the coming week.

One will be a meeting of the Birmingham Commission Tuesday night, at which Mr. Starr will be asked to explain details of the report, which has already been approved by committees representing each of the three units.

The other will be a joint meeting of the Bloomfield Hills Commission and the Bloomfield Township Board, at which the former will attempt to get from the latter a binding agreement that Bloomfield Hills is to take over the township garage, as provided in the proposal.

Reports Accepted For Study.
Copies of the report of Mr. Starr, who represents Bloomfield Hills in the settlement, were accepted for study by both the Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills commissions at their meetings this morning.

The report contains a mass of figures covering 16 typewritten pages, and Mayor Harry Allen suggested that Mr. Starr be invited to meet with the Commission to aid the members in their study.

City Manager James W. Farney said several questions concerning details of the report had arisen since the meeting.

A Bloomfield Hills Commission is desirous of securing a definite agreement from the township on its willingness to give up the title to the garage in order that it might extend the structure with CWA funds. An application for funds has been approved in CWA office in Lansing, and is awaiting final approval in Lansing; the Commission was informed Tuesday night.

The approval for labor only, but the Commission appears favorable to proceeding with the project even though it may be forced to provide all the materials. The east wing and entire second story of the garage should be transferred into offices and department headquarters for the city. The township offices would remain in the east wing.

Opposition Reported.
Although the Township Board had adopted a resolution approving the general method of settlement as outlined in Mr. Starr's proposal, the provision which states that Bloomfield Hills shall continue possession of the garage, and the members of the official committee representing the township in the settlement have voiced Mr. Starr's detailed report, signifying their acceptance, there still remains opposition to this provision among township officials.

It is being attempted to determine the reasons for this opposition and to overcome it in order that the project may not be held up in its progress through lack of a claim to the garage that the joint meeting of the Bloomfield Hills Commission and Township Board is to hold. Mr. Starr was instructed to call the meeting, for Friday night, but he said yesterday that a later date may have to be adopted because of inability of some of the township representatives to attend on Friday.
