

DUTY LACKING FOR RECOVERY

Stewart Finds Roosevelt Program Sadly In Need Of Co-ordination

WASHINGTON—What President Roosevelt's recovery program manifestly lacks is co-ordination. The National Emergency Council including the attorney general, the secretary of the interior, a graduate engineer, a labor organizer and the director of agricultural adjustment, federal relief and industrial recovery, the chairman of the Home Owners' Corporation Board and the Federal Trade Commission, the governor of the Farm Credit Administration and the federal administrator in consumer problems, but really run by Executive Director Frank G. Walker, originally was created to co-ordinate the activities of all of Uncle Sam's present alphabetical set-ups.

However, the Emergency Council's notion of co-ordination is merely superficial. It has no basic economic policy whatever.

Amoebic Dysentery Blamed For Death

Clare D. MacGregor, Advertising Official, Victim Of Unusual Disease; Rites Held Saturday

Funeral services for Clare D. MacGregor, advertising manager for the Detroit and Chicago districts of the Philadelphia Public Ledger, were held Saturday afternoon from the residence, 121 Washington road, Interment was in White Chapel Memorial Cemetery.

Mr. MacGregor died last Thursday morning in Harper Hospital, Detroit, of complications resulting from amoebic dysentery. He had been in poor health since returning from Chicago where he spent three months last summer, and had been seriously ill for three weeks before his death.

Mr. MacGregor had been a resident of Birmingham for eight years, coming here from Detroit where he had worked on the editorial staffs of the Detroit News and Free Press, and as an advertising representative for the Buroughs Adding Machine Company before joining the Ledger about seven years ago.

Born in Port Huron 47 years ago, he began newspaper work on the Port Huron Daily Times, and editorial work for papers in Duluth, Minn., Cleveland, Salt Lake City and other cities before coming to Detroit.

He leaves a wife, Mrs. Beatrice Barrum MacGregor, a daughter, Clara, 13 years old; and a sister, Mrs. Albert J. Scriven of Birmingham.
