'ARMY DAY' TO BE OBSERVED

Assisting Committee Named By Spencer For Celebration Here On April 6

Plans for Birmingham's observance of Army Day, to be celebrated throughout the county on April 6, were being completed this week by R. C. Spencer, commander of the local post of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, who has been appointed general chairman of the celebration here.

A joint committee of V. F. W. Post members and members of the Charles Edwards Post of the American Legion is assisting Mr. Spencer on the arrangements. The V. F. W. members are Roy Lewis, Earl Moody and Joseph F. MacGregor. The Legion committee includes Gordon L. Bailey, post commander, Ray Bethard and Barney Faulkner.

Army Day will be observed by the two posts at a joint meeting the evening of April 6, to be held at the Legion Home on South Woodward, avenue. Mr. Spencer said the speakers would probably include Harry Allen and Lt. Col. M. D. Mills, president of the Oakland County Chapter of the Reserve Officers Association. The same meeting will serve to mark the first anniversary of the Legion Post's occupancy of its home. In connection with Army Day, Mayor Allen has issued the following proclamation:

"Whereas the Army of the United States, for more than a century and a half, has performed splendid service in peace and war; and

"Whereas, an adequate and properly trained and equipped army of defense, composed of regular and civilian units, must be our principal hope for the prevention of war; and

"Whereas, the State of Michigan and this community have contributed of the men and women who have served and are serving with honor to their country, their state, their neighborhood and themselves; and

"Whereas, Friday, April 6, has been designated as 'Army Day,' in commemoration of the service of the Army;

"Therefore, be it resolved, that I, Harry Allen, mayor of the City of Birmingham, by virtue of the authority vested in me by law, do designate Friday, April 6, 1934, as 'Army Day,' and urge that all people participate in its observance; that the national colors be displayed, and that appropriate exercises be held in the schools and elsewhere, at which appreciation of the services rendered of our Army, and a tribute to our Michigan patriots who have died during the past year, may be expressed appropriately."
