

MAYOR MAY DRAW LEGAL CONTRACTS

Bloomfield Hills Approves Allen's Firm For Drafting Agreement in Settlement

The Bloomfield Hills Commission Tuesday night approved an agreement arrived at informally Monday between representatives of Birmingham, Bloomfield Hills and Bloomfield Township for preparation of the necessary legal contracts to complete the division of assets and liabilities of the three units.

The agreement called for the Detroit law firm of Rhea, Haas and Allen, of which Mayor Harry Allen of Birmingham is a member, to draw the contract. Mr. Atkinson said Mayor Allen told him the cost of the work would not exceed \$100.

The three units would share this cost in proportion to their assessed valuation. Bloomfield Hills share would be 16.4 per cent, or not more than \$875.

Monday night's agreement was reached at a conference following the Birmingham Commission meeting. It was attended by Mayor Allen, Mr. Atkinson, Supervisor Perry A. Vaughan of Bloomfield Township, and Floyd Blakester, township attorney. Bloomfield Hills, however, is the only unit of the three which has acted formally on the agreement to date.

Signing of the legal contract is all that remains to complete the settlement, which involves about \$125,000 in real estate and a \$200,000 in delinquent taxes. The general method of the settlement, and details concerning the actual division of the property, are submitted to representatives of the three units by Harry S. Starr, representing Bloomfield Hills, were signed by the governing bodies of all three about five weeks ago.
