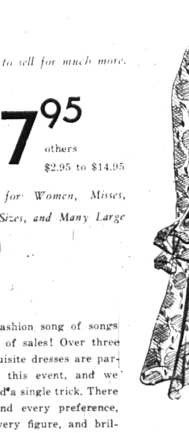

### CONTRACT BRIDGE

**THE VIENNA COUP**

AS OFTEN explained, the Vienna Coup consists of the establishment of one or more high cards in opponents' hands, then squeezing these established cards from their holders. The following hand, the work of the famous expert, Carl T. Robertson, was given several years ago to a body of duplicate players, of Cleveland, O. It affords one of the "finest" examples I have seen of the Vienna Coup.

♠ A Q 8 7  
♥ A 7 5 4  
♦ J 4  
♣ 10 7

West  
♠ K J 9 5  
♥ 8 6 3  
♦ K  
♣ K

Declarer  
♠ 4 3  
♥ J 6  
♦ A K Q 10 9 7 3  
♣ A 7

It is a lay-down for the rest of the tricks. If West lets go either a heart or a club, the declarer wins the last trick in the suit from which West discards, and again West is put through the discarding process. In case West lets go a spade, all four of dummy's spades will win, giving South his grand slam. The hand was from the first capable of winning the grand slam which it makes. Care alone was required to make the Vienna Coup.
