CHIEF GIVES WARNING ON BURNING OF GRASS
 Precautions in the burning of grass and undergrowth were issued yesterday by Fire Chief Vernon W. Griffith in an attempt to decrease the large number of grass fires which have swept open lots and fields this spring.

Grass should never be burned while a high wind is blowing, Chief Griffith said, and a garage hose and water supply should always be available in case the fire should get out of control. Before a lot is burned, application for a permit should be made to the fire department, which will supervise the job.

Chief Griffith also repeated the warning that to avoid roof fires, dampers should be kept closed when papers and rubbish are burned in furnaces.
