ARRESTS DROP TO 64 HERE IN APRIL

Nine Persons Arrested Are Juveniles. Traffic Bureau Total \$74.

Lawbreaking took a decline here in April, when police made only 64 arrests, according to the monthly report of Miss Carrie Stoddard, police clerk. Arrests in March totaled 90.

Fines collected at the Traffic Violations Bureau during the past month amounted to only \$74, as compared with \$110 the month before, the report shows.

Nine of the persons arrested in April were juveniles, four of whom were charged with delinquency, two with destruction of property, and three with simple larceny. All the other arrests were for misdemeanors. These included 18 cases of illegal parking, 10 of drunkenness, eight of speeding, six of reckless driving, five of drunk driving, three of violating traffic signals, and one each of assault and battery, driving with improper lights, and driving without an operator's license. One person was arrested for investigation and another on a warrant for another jurisdiction.

Five persons were injured in traffic accidents, of which three were in 19 during the month, according to the report. One automobile was stolen and later recovered. There was one holdup, and six simple larcenies were reported. The articles stolen in one of the larcenies were recovered.

Police answered 127 calls and investigated 75 complaints. Eight persons were bitten by dogs and 25 men were given free lodging in the city jail.

Found guilty of drunk driving in a trial before Justice Forbes, J. H. Hascall in Municipal Court Friday, April 27, Warren, Mich., placed on probation for two years and ordered to pay \$10 costs. Henke, a farmer, had pleaded not guilty to the charge following his arrest April 21.
