Mrs. Theodore MacManus Is Awarded Papal Honors

Fittingly solemn and impressive ceremonies in the Chapel-St. Hugo of the Hills Sunday night attended the awarding of the Papal Medal, "Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice," with purple ribbon, to Mrs. Theodore P. MacManus of Bloomfield Hills.

The award, one of the few ever made to a woman in the Detroit Diocese, was conferred upon Mrs. MacManus "for extraordinary generosity in the support of foreign missions and for aid in the building of the University of the Holy Spirit, as well as for aid given to her husband in the erection of the Hills Chapel." The chapel was erected by Mr. and Mrs. MacManus as a memorial to their sons, Hugo and Hubert.

The medal was awarded by Bishop Michael J. Gallagher before a congregation of more than 300 persons. Bishop Gallagher was assisted in the ceremony by members of the diocesan clergy, including the Rev. Fr. Albert H. Poesker, S. J., president of the University of Detroit; the Rev. Fr. Lake Bertsch, O. F. M., pastor of St. Dunas College; the Rev. Fr. William Murphy, the Rev. Fr. William Cogley, S. J., and the Rev. Fr. Anthony Dean of the Holy Spirit.

"His Holiness, Pope Pius XI is giving this distinction to Mrs. MacManus as a mark of appreciation of the Church of God for extending the border of the church through aiding the foreign missionary work and for the building of this church in this diocese," Bishop Gallagher said in conferring the award.

"The purple in the church records signifies power and authority and the right to wear it is an honor. This couple have helped the universal spread of Christianity, and their generosity is wished to build this church as a monument to their sons, Hugo and Hubert, as proof of their faith in and love of Christ.

"The diocese appreciates highly the spirit that prompted this noble gift. For that reason and for the work they have done in the missions fields, I petition the Pope to bestow his blessing on this good family. We feel confident Mrs. MacManus will be rewarded with a greater than the one given her here tonight."

The ceremony was followed by a reception later in the evening at the Bloomfield Hills Country Club.

ASTRONOMER TO TALK AT INSTITUTE OF ARTS

A trip through space to the stars thousands of billions of miles away is scheduled for 3:30 P. M. Sunday at the Detroit Institute of Arts, when Dr. Hever D. Curtis, noted astronomer and traveler, will present his illustrated lecture, "Around the World to Chase a Shadow."

For four years Dr. Curtis represented the Eck Observatory at Santiago, Chile. For 10 years he was director of the Allegheny Observatory at Pittsburgh. Since 1930, he has been director of the University of Michigan observatory.
