These figures are from the records in Oakland County Board of Auditors offices. The net operating cost for 1933, the first year of Sheriff Reynolds term, after subtracting the off-setting income, was \$80.518.80, or 781.20 less than the drastically reduced budget fixed by the Board of Supervisors for the Sheriff's Department.
