Postoffice Needs Only Normal December Business To Keep Rating \$40,000 TOTAL TO DATE

Stamp sales at the Birmingham postoffice, now on almost a normal level, continue their normal trend through December...

Receipts from stamp sales, by which the rating of all postoffices is determined, totaled \$40,335.80 at the Birmingham office from Jan. 1 of this year to the close of business Tuesday night...
