YEAR'S PLANS

Program Committee To Present Details To Board Of Directors

Birmingham's 1934-35 V. M. C. A. program is expected to be outlined in detail at meeting of the V. M. C. A. Board of Directors to be held some time next week, the exact date to be announced later. A program committee and a budget and finance committee, appointed last Thursday when the Board held a dinner meeting at the Community House, will report at the meeting next week. The program committee is composed of Robert D. Lynd, secretary of the V. M. C. A., F. Morse Cook and Raymond H. Peck. Members of the budget and finance committee are Everett Don, W. E. Moody and T. M. Faddis. At present, tentative plans call for the organization of a section H-Y Club at Baldwin High School, and of Junior H-Y Clubs in each of the three junior high schools, as well as of grade clubs in the elementary schools. In addition, the V. M. C. A. is planning to bring to Birmingham during the coming year, four outstanding speakers to give public addresses on subjects appealing to youth. Mr. Peck said yesterday, Mr. Lynd and Mr. Peck, and possibly other representatives of the local "V." are planning to attend the State V. M. C. A. conference to be held at Lansing Oct. 16. The Birmingham organization has a delegation of seven local youths to the Older Boys' Conference in Lansing, Nov. 30, and Dec. 1 and 2.

Dr. Hopkins' Father Dies In California

Funeral services were held in Glendale, Cal., Monday for William S. Hopkins, father of the Rev. Dr. R. D. Hopkins, pastor of the First Methodist Church. Mr. Hopkins died suddenly from a heart attack. He was 76 years old. Until five years ago, when he moved to California, he had been a resident of Detroit and a member of the Metropolitan M. E. Church. Besides Dr. Hopkins, the family includes another son, Benoit Hopkins of Cleveland, and two daughters, Mrs. Ralph Stanley of Highland Park, Mich., and Mrs. James M. Evans of Alhambra, Cal.

BIRMINGHAM SCHOOLS TO BE CLOSED FRIDAY

All Birmingham public schools will be closed Friday for the entire day while the teachers attend the annual Michigan Education Association Institute in Detroit. The Gleo Clubs of Barroom, Adams and Baldwin Junior High Schools will provide musical entertainment for the junior high division of the Institute. Mrs. Edith B. Arvill, supervisor of vocal music in the local schools, will direct. A roundtable discussion on the first year Latin course, conducted by Miss Muriel Brusic of the Adams Junior High School, is listed on the program for one of the afternoon sectional meetings, and Arnold W. Berndt, supervisor of instrumental music in the Birmingham schools, will serve as chairman of a sectional meeting on music, also in the afternoon.

Asa Richardson, blessed nine new members into the congregation. The church is non-sectarian, and holds its services in the music room at Barnum School.

Russian Violinist To Offer Recital

Alexander Kaminsky, known as the imperial Russian violinist, will offer a recital of sacred music at the First Methodist Church here Sunday evening. The program will begin at 7:30 o'clock. Mr. Kaminsky was formerly a member of the Royal Grand Opera in Moscow, and played before the late Czar Nicholas in the days before the Revolution. He was awarded a medal for his playing on the 10th anniversary of the czar's reign. For the past five years, Mr. Kaminsky has devoted his talents to the work of the church.
