

# FERA OFFERS NEW COURSES

### Registration Opens For Commercial Subjects, And Nursery School

Commercial studies have been added to the list of courses to be offered here under the FERA adult education courses, and registration in these courses is now being taken by Robert D. Lynd, administrative supervisor, at his offices in the High School building, it was announced yesterday.

The commercial courses are open only to two classifications of students: first, unemployed adults who have had previous wage earning experience in commercial lines; and second, those who have had some training in commercial subjects, but have never been employed. Those in the second class must now be receiving welfare aid.

two and five will also be opened, providing there is sufficient demand. Mr. Lynd announced. Registration of children for such a school is now open. The school would be in charge of a nurse, a cook and two teachers, and the children would be taught games and exercises. Mr. Lynd said. They would be given a lunch of proper foods at noon, and rested properly in the afternoon.

A gymnasium class for women held its first meeting Tuesday night, and if the enrollment continues to grow, an afternoon class will be added to the program. Mr. Lynd said. An evening gymnasium class for men will also be opened if there is sufficient demand. A minimum enrollment of 10 persons for each class is required.

The total enrollment in the program to date is more than 150. Mr. Lynd said yesterday.

## LAND TRADE PROBLEM UP

### State Offers City 30 Cents Per Square Foot For Derby Well Site

The exchange of property owned by the city on the old Grand Tusk right-of-way for a plot along the new tracks is a problem confronting city officials today.

An offer of 30 cents a square foot for the property on which the city's Derby Well tank now stands has been made by James McQuinn, who has been appointed by the State Highway Commission to finish the acquisition of right-of-way preparatory to the completion of Wider Woodward avenue through Birmingham.

The offer was made known to the City Commission Monday night by Harold H. Corson, treasurer and engineer, who said it also included a sum of \$500 for the building which houses the well pump. The city owns between 15,000 and 16,000 square feet of property at the pump site.

For property on the new right-of-way, the state would charge the city \$3,000 an acre, Mr. Corson said. The city desires a plot on the new right-of-way for a warehouse. Mr. Corson said he believed a piece of about two acres could be obtained for approximately the same amount as the city would receive from the state for the sale of its Derby Well site. Whether the cost of moving the water pump and tank would have

The tank would probably be moved as short a distance as possible to clear it from the path of the new highway.

"I do not want to live under a tank or not want to be taken care of by the government either directly or by any instruments through which the government is acting. I want only to have right and justice prevail so far as I am concerned. I give me right and justice and I will undertake to take care of myself. I will not live under trustees if I can help it. I do not care how wise, how patriotic, the trustees may be. I have

never heard of any group of men in whose hands I am willing to lodge the liberties of America in trust."

**Haber's Letter**  
"The State Relief Administration is now aware of the fact that the funds available from the Federal Emergency Relief Administration and the one million dollar monthly appropriation from the state sales tax will not be sufficient to meet the relief needs this winter. It becomes imperative, therefore, to secure the cooperation of the county boards of supervisors and other local public officials toward appropriating local funds for relief needs.

"The State Relief Administration authorities wish to advise county boards of supervisors and other officials that it is prepared to withhold state and federal funds from any county or other political subdivision which fails to definitely arrange for contributing toward the cost of relief this winter.

"We are requesting that the local authorities assume the burden of relief which it is necessary to provide within each county. Where definite proof is presented to the effect that the resources of local political subdivisions do not make possible a contribution of as much as one-third, we shall authorize county relief administrations to enter into agreements for some other reasonable proportion.

"In any event, a definite understanding must be reached between the county relief administration and the county authorities concerning this problem before Nov. 1."

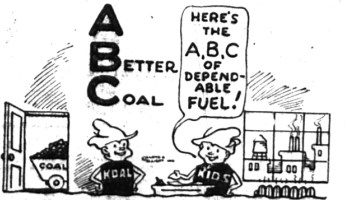

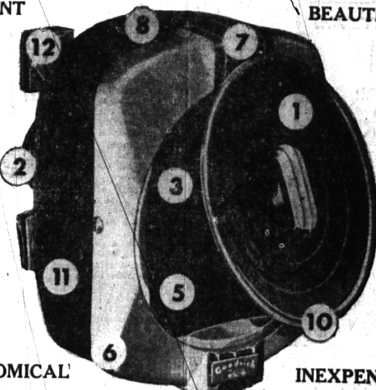
