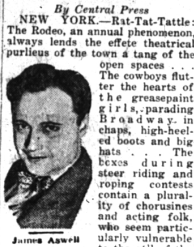

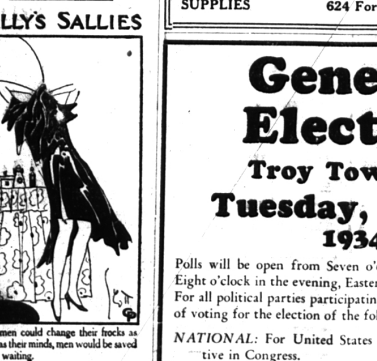
FASHIONS FOR MEN

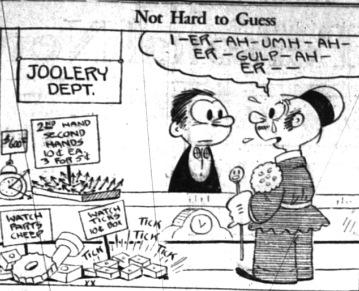

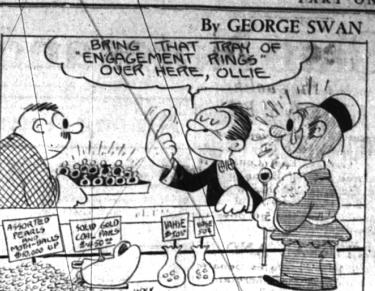

COUNTY: Prosecuting Attorney, Sheriff, County Clerk, County Treasurer, Register of Deeds, 2 Circuit Court Commissioners, Drain Commissioner, 2 Coroners, County Surveyor.
