Parent Education Meet Nov. 1

Local Delegation Planning To Attend Annual Three-Day Institute In Ann Arbor

Several Birmingham residents are planning to attend the fifth annual Parent Education Institute, to be held in Ann Arbor, Nov. 1, 2 and 3, under the auspices of the extension division of the University of Michigan, in cooperation with the Michigan Congress of Parents and Teachers and the School of Education of the University.

The program will open Thursday, Nov. 1, at 10 A. M. in the auditorium of the University High School, and continue through the three days with addresses, conferences and discussions. Out-of-state speakers will include Dr. LeRoy E. Bowman of the Child Study Association of America, New York City, and Dr. Caroline Hedger, of the Elizabeth McCormick Memorial Fund, Chicago.

The meeting on Thursday evening at which Dr. Bowman will speak on "The Home and the Community," a panel discussion on the subject of financing Michigan schools on Friday evening, and a luncheon Saturday noon, when Dr. Paul F. Voecker, state superintendent of public instruction, will speak, are all open to the public.

The enrollment fee for the entire three days will be \$1, and for a single day or individual session, 50 cents.

STATE OF MICHIGAN—ORDER OF THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION—BACCOON.

The Director of Conservation, having made a thorough investigation of conditions relative to racoon in the State recommends certain regulations.

THEREFORE, the Conservation Commission, by authority of Act 218, P. A. 1923, hereby orders that for a period of 1933, hereby orders that for a period of one year from November 1st, 1934, it shall be unlawful to hunt, take, or kill or attempt to hunt, take, or kill any racoon in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan and to hunt, take, or kill or attempt to hunt, take, or kill any racoon in the Lower Peninsula of Michigan, excepting that it shall be lawful to hunt racoons from November 1st to 31st, inclusive, and it shall be lawful to trap racoons in the Lower Peninsula north of the north line of T. J. N. and west of Saginaw Bay from November 15th to December 15th, inclusive, and south of the north line of T. J. N. and east of Saginaw Bay from December 1st to 15th, inclusive.
