

AMENDMENTS PERIL SCHOOLS

Moore Says Weight, Gas Tax Limitations Would Harm Education

The financial welfare of Michigan's public school system is dependent upon defeat of the proposed weight and gas tax amendments, and adoption of the amendment to abolish the uniform rule of taxation and open the way for passage of a state income tax, State Senator A. L. Moore of Pontiac told 150 school teachers and others at a meeting in Baldwin High School last Thursday afternoon, sponsored by the Birmingham Teachers Club.

Senator Moore pleaded forcefully with his audience to vote

"no" on amendments No. 2 and No. 3—the gas and weight tax limitation amendments—and to vote "yes" on amendment No. 5, which would enable the Legislature to reclassify property and tax it on its income-earning power, and to pass a state income tax.

He also recommended a "no" vote on amendment No. 6, which deals with the jurisdiction of justice of the peace courts, but made no recommendations regarding amendments No. 1 and No. 4. All six amendments are to be voted on at the regular election in November.

Hits Exemption Clause
Adoption of amendment No. 2, which would reduce the gasoline rate of taxation and open the way for an immediate reduction of \$6,500,000 in annual income to the State Highway Department, Senator Moore said.

In addition, he asserted, the manner in which amendments No. 2 and No. 3 are worded would have the effect, if they were adopted, of exempting the gasoline
