

Quarton Lake Not A Health Menace

But Water Is Unsafe For Drinking And Swimming, Kemp Reports After Survey

Quarton Lake, despite its unsightliness and uncleanliness, is not a menace to public health, Dr. William Lloyd Kemp, city health officer, declared in a report to the City Commission Monday night.

The report was based on a survey made by Dr. Kemp at the request of Mayor Harry Allen, who had received numerous complaints from residents of the Quarton Lake district, claiming the lake was detrimental to health.

"The water of the lake, like that of the River Rouge, is contaminated and polluted, and for purposes of drinking and swimming is unsafe," Dr. Kemp said in his report. "As I understand it, every effort is being made to bring about as speedy and adequate correction of this condition as possible, so far as Birmingham is concerned.

"However, it is my opinion that the present condition of Quarton Lake does not constitute a health menace."

\$500 Goal Set in Week's Drive For Home Service Funds

A solicitation of funds for maintenance of the Salvation Army's Home Service will be held in Birmingham next week, from Monday through Saturday, it was announced yesterday by Harry Harp, Salvation Army envoy in charge of the drive.

The solicitation will be conducted only in the business district, and will probably be followed by a tag day sale, Mr. Harp said. A Home Service Board, headed by Wesley A. Gibson, as major, has been organized to do the canvassing.

The goal in the drive is \$500, and the money will be used to help support the Salvation Army Home Service program as it is carried on in various institutions of the organization.

Hills Moves To Bar Private Policemen

Passed by the expressed purpose of prohibiting residential police patrols from operating in Bloomfield Hills, an ordinance was adopted by the Bloomfield Commission Tuesday night establishing the license fee for such patrols at \$100 a year, and requiring the posting of a \$5,000 bond.

The ordinance is nearly identical with one adopted in Birmingham about two years ago, although the Birmingham Commission has since amended it to eliminate the bond requirement. Harry S. Starr, acting chief of police, and Mayor Donald D. James both recommended adoption of the ordinance.

Birmingham Man And Wife Held Up By Chicago Thugs

A terrifying experience with the bandits who held them at the point of guns for three-quarters of an hour and robbed them of \$110 in cash and several articles of jewelry was being described yesterday by Mr. and Mrs. G. C. Good, 952 Wimpleton drive, on their return from a trip to Chicago.

The holdup occurred late Monday on Harlem avenue, just outside Oak Park, Ill., about 15 miles from Chicago. It was about 5 P. M. and still daylight when a car drove up behind them and blew its horn. Mrs. Good related:

"We had been driving fast and I supposed the siren was that of a police car," she said. "But when we stopped, two men jumped out and came around on either side of our car, pointing revolvers at us. The driver remained at the wheel and kept us covered with a machine gun.

"No, we're not policemen, this is a stickup," one of the men said. Then they ordered us in the back seat and drove our car about five miles up a country road, their own car following behind."

City To Consult Residents On Wider Fire Limit Plan

In accordance with a plan approved by the City Commission Monday night, City Manager James W. Parry is planning to call a meeting of residents in districts outside the city limits who are known to be particularly interested in securing fire protection from Birmingham on a prepaid contract basis.

The meeting, at which the residents would talk over the proposal with members of the Commission, is planned as the next step in the development of a fire protection scheme for outlying areas which was first proposed two weeks ago.

To date, the proposal, involving the addition of equipment and personnel to the local department, is being given a preliminary study to areas within a nine minute radius of the Municipal Building, has met with only slight response from property owners eligible to subscribe for such service. Trial Hastened So Defendant Won't Miss Nuptial Date
