## CONTRACT BRIDGE

ONLY ONE WENT GAME

OUT OF eight players sitting South in a recent duplicate game, only one went game at 4-3, doubled by West. In each case the opening lead was the 3 of hearts. South had gone game, or did the defense favor the one who went game?

♠ 7 6 4  
♥ K Q 5 2  
♦ K J 4 2  
♣ Q 8

♠ K Q 9 5  
♥ J 9 8 3  
♦ A 5  
♣ J 6 5

♠ A J 10 8 3  
♥ A 7 4  
♦ 3  
♣ A K 9 4

Bidding went: South, 1-Spade; North, 2-Hearts; South, 3-Clubs; North, 3-Spades; South, 4-Spades; West doubled.

The opening lead of the 3 of hearts was won with dummy's Q. There is no way the declarer can avoid giving West the Ace of diamonds and two spade tricks. If South can avoid giving West an added trump trick he can go game, but not otherwise. The fortunate player who went game did so by playing as described below.

Dummy's 2 of spades was led. Declarer's 10 lost to the Q, giving the doubler his first trick. Further than open a new suit West led by 8 of hearts, losing to declarer's Ace.

The 1 of clubs was led. Dummy's Q won. The 8 of clubs was led back and South was in with the K. He led off his only diamond. West's Ace won his second defensive trick. He led the 9 of hearts. Then open a new suit West led by 8 of hearts, losing to declarer's Ace.

## With \$435,000 Dollhouse, Actress Plays 'Good Fairy' To Thousands Of Children

A beautiful, half-million-dollar doll house has been built to bring happiness, not to a pampered American heiress or European princess, but to thousands of girls and boys—throughout America. The miniature fairy castle, which in life size would out-dazzle the palace of the most fabulously rich Indian prince, is being taken on a world tour, to raise funds for the benefit of America's crippled children.

Completion of the toy mansion marked fulfillment of a childhood dream of Colleen Moore, who, in her earnings finding it, said recently: "Some people collect old masters; others spend money on polonaises. Through my House 'My pet extravagance happened to be a doll's house. And now that clock keeps time. The furniture is all silver.

Tiny Refrigerator In the kitchen, tiny electric refrigerator. Upstairs, the princess's bedroom is done entirely in mother-of-pearl, with gold and silver furniture and murals which carry a Peter Pan theme. The royal bathtub is illuminated by indirect lighting.
