## DEADLINE FOR CAB METERS EXTENDED

Rate Schedule Delay Causes Parry To Grant Equipment Stay Until Jan. 31

Taxicab companies have been given until Jan. 31 to install meters on their cabs. City Manager James L. Parry informed the City Commission Monday night.

The deadline established by the Commission's resolution requiring cabs to be equipped with meters expires Jan. 29, but this had to be extended, Mr. Parry said, because of delays in preparing a proposed rate schedule to be used with the meters.

Figure on operating costs and other data needed in preparing the schedule are not available in satisfactory form from the two cab companies themselves, Mr. Parry said, so he has asked H. A. Pearson, General Motors Truck Company official, for assistance in drawing up the schedule, which is to be approved by the Commission before it becomes effective. Because of a recent illness of Mr. Pearson, some of the report has been delayed, Mr. Parry said.

In the Commission's discussion of the subject Monday, Commissioner Lawrence H. Hubert recommended the establishment of a base rate from the intersection of Woodward and Main avenues to the Grand Trunk Railway depot, rate for longer or shorter trips to be determined accordingly.

"I would recommend a rate between the intersection and the depot that won't militate against the people using that suburban service," Mr. Hubert said. "That's something we want to foster."
