Parry Is Speaker As New Officers

Former Cadillac Employee Expires

Grant A. Roush, 64, Dies Of Heart
Ailment: Funeral Services
Held Monday

Grant A. Roush, 512 Wallace
street, for nearly 40 years a
employee of the Cadillac Motor
company, died of a heart ailment
Thursday night in Warren Avenue
Diagnostic Hospital, Detroit. He
had been ill since Christmas.

Mr. Roush was 64 years old, and
had lived in Birmingham since re-
tiring eight years ago. Funeral
services were held from the resi-
dence Monday afternoon, with
burial in Pine Lake Cemetery. The
Rev. W. Clarence Wright, pastor
of the First Presbyterian Church,
officiated.

Mr. Roush was born in New
Philadelphia, O., and was brought
to Detroit when he was a small boy.
He worked for Cadillac first as a
molder and later as factory fore-
man.

Surviving are the widow, Mrs.
Frances Roush; a son, Hugh V. of
Detroit; a daughter, Mrs. Pearl
Morrison of Birmingham; two
brothers, Harry of Detroit and Val
of Buffalo; and four sisters, Mrs.

Tuesday.


Books discussed during the first
